

NSR *Fall classic* Nov. 16-19

2011 Rules & Regulations

NEW!

The Stephens County Fair & Expo Center will coordinate the Claud Gill Arena to provide trailer parking and housing of **all swine that are not entered** in the Fall Classic shows and sales. A **\$50 fee per vehicle**, will be charged for all vehicles with swine that are housed at the Claud Gill Arena.

General Information

Entry fees must accompany the entry form. All late entries will be charged double the regular entry fees. Entry fees are non-refundable. The NSR reserves the right to close entries after the printed deadline. **Entries must be postmarked by Oct. 14, 2011.**

All hogs entered at the Fall Classic must have been owned by Sept. 18, 2011, by the exhibitor.

All hogs must arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m., Wednesday, Nov. 16, and 9 a.m., Thursday, Nov. 17.

CROSSBRED BOARDS: Stress status of your entry will be placed in the show and sale catalog (this is a show and sale requirement). A documented stress test must be presented at check in.

All entries must be ear notched using the official NSR system (starting with litter number 1 in January and again in July each year). All entries must be recorded by Nov. 4, 2011, or they will be charged a rush fee.

Entries will be divided into classes as equal as possible by farrowing date.

Exhibitors & Eligibility

Exhibitors must be an active member of the NSR, or they will be required to pay the \$75 NSR maintenance fee.

Entries are limited to four boars and four open gilts per breed (Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire) per exhibitor. All entries must be farrowed on or after April 1, 2011, and must have at least six teats on each side.

Each hog must be accompanied by a registration certificate and meet their respective breed requirements. Entries that do not meet these requirements will not be allowed to show or sell at the Fall Classic.

Breeding Animal Sale

A minimum of 60 percent of the number of each sex (boars and gilts) shown will be selected for the sale. These animals will be selected with no set number selling from any single class. Animals not selected for the sale can be consigned to the sale for an additional fee of \$20 per head. If the animal sells, the fee will be applied toward the sale commission. If the animal does not sell, the fee is forfeited.

All animals selected and cataloged for the sale must go through the auction. Sale commission will be 15 percent for all animals. If an animal that is selected and cataloged for the sale does not go through the sale ring, the exhibitor will be banned from exhibiting at NSR events for one year and will be charged 15% of the average selling price of their respective breed sale. This amount must be paid before reinstatement will be allowed. The exception to this rule will be if the animal has become injured or ill and the animal is inspected by a NSR staff member prior to the sale.

The NSR acts only as the agent between the buyer and seller. If proper payment is made by the buyer in a timely manner, the NSR will make settlement with the seller in approximately 30 days after the sale.

If an exhibitor has an account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their NSR account.

Special Breed Requirements

HAMPSHIRE & YORKSHIRE EXHIBITORS

By entering any hog in the Fall Classic, the owner warrants that the hog meets specific breed requirements.

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the HSR and AYC, and the HSR and AYC assumes no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at the Fall Classic is found to be a carrier of the color gene after being tested through the procedures approved by the HSR and AYC, the seller agrees that he will promptly refund the full purchase price to the buyer.

There will be no refund of NSR commission from animals that are carriers of the color gene.

DNA Stress Statement

No known stress positive or stress-carrier Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire animals will be allowed to be exhibited or sold at any NSR-sponsored event.

Such warranty is, however, solely that of the seller and not that of the American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry or United Duroc Swine Registry.

The American Landrace Association, American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry and United Duroc Swine Registry assume no responsibility or liability in connection with such warranty by the seller.

If any animal sold at this conference is found to be a carrier of the stress gene, the purchaser has the right to receive full refund of the purchase price from the seller.

DNA testing for the stress gene must be done within 60 days of the sale date and all costs associated with the testing for the stress gene must be paid by the purchaser. The seller has the right to review the test results and the right to re-test the animal at a laboratory of his choice.

Cost associated with re-test by the seller is at the seller's expense. **There will be no refund of NSR commission from stress-carrier animals.**

Health Regulations

- Each animal must be accompanied by **TWO COPIES** of an official interstate health certificate issued by a licensed, accredited veterinarian. **Certificate must show name and address of consignor; consigned to Fall Classic, Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK, 73533; individual identification of the animal; and health status of animal including the dates of required tests and vaccinations. Crossbred animals must be identified by a federally recognized numbered ear tag.**
- All certificates must be issued on or after **Oct. 22, 2011, with the following information:**
 - All hogs must be tested for pseudorabies (PRV) and brucellosis after Oct. 22, 2011, unless they come from a PRV-qualified and brucellosis-validated herd. Swine tested for PRV and brucellosis must show the date blood sample was drawn (month, day and year). Either the Elisa, PCFIA, ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable Elisa test will not be accepted. If the herd of origin is PRV qualified and brucellosis validated, individual testing of the swine will not be required. In this case, the PRV qualification and brucellosis validation numbers must appear on the health certificate and complete quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on certificate.
 - All animals coming to the show **MUST** be vaccinated against Leptospirosis (6-way) including bratislava and erysipelas on or after Oct. 22, 2011. The complete date of vaccination **MUST** be listed on the health certificate.
 - All out of state entries** must have a permit number. The accredited veterinarian may obtain permit number by calling the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture at 405.522.6141.
- Certificates are not required to be stamped by the state of origin.
- Prior to unloading, state officials will inspect animals and health certificates.
- These rules are the same for breeding stock and weaning pigs.
- In some instances, these rules are in addition to Oklahoma regulations, but are necessary to sell animals into some states.
- Your driver's license number must be included on your health papers.
- A premises ID number will be required to exhibit hogs.

- Crossbred boars must have a state approved permanent numbered tag and a documented stress test must be presented at check in.**
 - No clipping is allowed in the barns.**

Each breeder may enter a maximum of four purebred open gilts and four purebred boars from each breed and two crossbred boars. Boars and gilts must be farrowed on or after April 1, 2011. Ear notches, farrowing dates and entry fees for each animal must accompany the entry blank.

2011 Weanling Pig Rules & Regulations

ATTENTION: All breeds of weanling pigs for the 2011 Fall Classic must be entered through the NSR office.

General Information

Entry fees for all entries must accompany the respective entry form and **all late entries will be charged double the regular entry fees. All entry fees are non-refundable.** The NSR reserves the right to close entries because of pen space limitations any time after the printed deadline.

All entries must be postmarked by Oct. 14, 2011. All entries must be recorded by Nov. 4, 2011. After that date, exhibitors will be charged a rush fee for their registration papers.

All hogs must arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m., Wednesday, Nov. 16, and 9 a.m., Thursday, Nov. 17.

All weanling pig entries must be checked in by 11 a.m. on Thursday, Nov. 17. **All pigs selected for the respective sales (female and male) must be offered for sale.**

All exhibitors must be active members of their respective breed association(s) or must pay the \$75 Fall Classic participation fee. An active member must have recorded at least one litter in the 2011 fiscal year.

If an exhibitor has an NSR account that is past due, funds from the sale of their animals will be applied to their past-due account.

Only exhibitors who have consigned animals to the Fall Classic will be allowed to bring additional animals onto the Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK, 73533. However, these additional animals must abide by the same health requirements imposed on the Fall Classic entries.

REMINDER: All exhibitors transporting additional animals will be required to obtain an official "Sales Permit" from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture staff when entering the Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK, 73533.

Before leaving the Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK, 73533, this permit must be returned to agents of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, with a detailed buyers list documenting the destination of each animal (including pre-purchased deliveries, parking-lot sales and sifted weanling pigs).

- Your driver's license number must be included on your health papers.
- A premises ID number will be required to exhibit.

Health Regulations

All animals (breeding stock and weanling pigs) entering the Stephens County Fairgrounds must meet these health regulations:

1. Each animal must be accompanied by **TWO COPIES** of an official interstate health certificate issued by a licensed, accredited veterinarian. **Certificate must show name and address of consignor; consigned to Fall Classic, Stephens County Expo and Fair, 2002 South 13th Street, Duncan, OK, 73533; individual identification of the animal; and health status of animal including the dates of required tests and vaccinations. Crossbred animals must be identified by a federally recognized numbered ear tag.**
2. **All certificates must be issued on or after Oct. 22, 2011, with the following information:**
 - A. All hogs must be tested for pseudorabies (PRV) and brucellosis after Oct. 22, 2011, unless they come from a PRV-qualified and brucellosis-validated herd. Swine tested for PRV and brucellosis must show the date blood sample was drawn (month, day and year). Either the Elisa, PCFIA, ALA or S/N tests are acceptable. Differentiable Elisa test will not be accepted. If the herd of origin is PRV qualified and brucellosis validated, individual testing of the swine will not be required. In this case, the PRV qualification and brucellosis validation numbers must appear on the health certificate and complete quarterly herd test date (month, day and year) must be stated on certificate.
 - B. All animals must be vaccinated for 6-way Lepto (brastislava included) on or after Oct. 22, 2011, with vaccination date listed on health certificate.
 - C. **All out of state entries** must have a permit number. The accredited veterinarian may obtain permit number by calling the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture at 405.522.6141.
 - D. **All pigs must be vaccinated for circovirus. This is a sale requirement.**
 - E. It is recommended that all pigs be vaccinated for mycoplasma and swine influenza. Two injections given at least two weeks apart is preferred. These products are available commercially from several vaccine companies. This is not a sale requirement.
3. Certificates are not required to be stamped by the state of origin.
4. Prior to unloading, officials will inspect animals and certificates.
5. These rules are the same for breeding stock and weanling pigs.
6. In some instances, these rules are in addition to Oklahoma regulations, but are necessary to sell animals into some states.

2011 Fall Classic Weanling Pig Entry Form

All entries must be postmarked by Oct. 14, 2011

A. No clipping allowed in barns.

B. Same health requirements as breeding stock.

C. Should weigh between 40 and 70 pounds (not required).

D. It is recommended not to dock tails.

E. All purebred weanling pigs that show in the purebred class must have a pedigree that accompanies each entry.

F. Entries are open to all eight breeds and all crossbreds. Classes will be divided by breed, sex and the number exhibited.

G. Exhibitors are limited to six weanling pigs (barrows, boars or gilts). Weanling entries **CANNOT** and **WILL NOT** be accepted at the show!
